SUPERVISION GUIDELINES SCHEDULE

ARRIVAL

Boys Basketball/ Football

Supervisors are to arrive **30 minutes** prior to event. Supervisors are expected to remain at their assigned stations throughout the event.

All Other Sports

All supervisors are expected to arrive at their assignment **15 minutes** prior to the start of the event. Supervisors are expected to remain at their assigned stations throughout the event.

Scorers

Scorers should arrive **20 minutes** before start of event.

DISMISSAL

Home:

- Crowd should be dispersed before leaving area.
- A supervisor must escort the visiting team to their buses and remain with bus until departure.
- If there are multiple supervisors ***one*** must escort the visiting team to the bus. All others should remain with the crowd until it disperses.

Away:

- Supervisors are to escort our team to the District bus and wait for bus departure.

SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

9. Supervisors should enforce all Section VIII rules and insure that all spectators are acting appropriately (please see attached).
10. Supervisors **must** address unruly athletes/spectators *immediately*. Address fans' use of foul language, unsportsmanship actions, and poor behavior. If a student or other fan is not responding to your request for cooperation notify an administrator as soon as possible. In case of emergency contact Saul Lerner 516-238-9582.
11. If a parent or a student is asked to leave the game due to poor behavior, a brief report of the incident should be submitted to the assistant principal for athletics at the high school level and the principal for the middle school.

IN CASE OF INJURY

HOME/AWAY

1. If the athletic trainer is on-site alert him/her immediately.
2. Check with the coach for instructions.
3. **HOME GAMES:** Call Fire Department for Medical Assistance for school as indicated:

- ❖ N. Bellmore 781-9200 Grand M.S. and Mephram M.S.
- ❖ N. Merrick 221-1500 Merrick M.S. and Calhoun H.S.

If there is no response call the Nassau County Police Department 911.

AWAY GAMES: *Make sure to communicate with home site supervisor/coach for District emergency procedures.*

4. If the parents of the injured player are at the game, you may release the player to only the parent. You are **not** to release the player to friends, neighbors, siblings, or any other relative.
5. If parent not on site, call the parents. If they can not be reached call the family doctor or alternate listed on emergency contact card.
6. Give the information from the Emergency Contact Card to the emergency medical team.
7. If the parent is not available to accompany the student, then follow the ambulance in your vehicle. **DO NOT TRANSPORT STUDENT IN YOUR VEHICLE.**
8. The supervisor must remain with the child at the hospital until relieved by administrator or parent.
9. In an emergency situation if you are unsure how to proceed call Saul Lerner District Director of Athletics 516-295-6369 or 516-238-9582.
10. Notify your building administrator as soon as possible.

Section VIII Sportsmanship Codes

SPECTATORS

It is the responsibility of the spectator to:

- 1) Cheer Positively. Profanity and/or degrading language/gestures are prohibited.**
- 2) Avoid actions which offend visiting teams, individual players, and or officials.**
- 3) Show appreciation of good players on both teams.**
- 4) Treat all visiting teams and officials with a respectful, professional and appropriate manner.**
- 5) Abide by all rules and regulations of the game.**
- 6) Accept victory and defeat with grace and dignity.**
- 7) Recognize that improper behavior reflects negatively on yourself, your school, your team and your community.**

STRICTLY PROHIBITED

1. TRESPASSING.
2. LOITERING.
3. OPERATING OF MOTOR VEHICLES, MOTORCYCLES OR SCOOTERS ON LAWNS, PLAYING FIELDS OR TRACKS.
4. CLIMBING ON BUILDINGS OR FENCES.
5. USE OF ANY UNLICENSED MOTOR VEHICLES, eg., MOTORCYCLES, MINI BIKES, GO CARTS, etc.
6. FLYING MODEL AIRPLANES OR GOLF PLAYING.
7. USE OF PROFANE, LOUD OR ABUSIVE LANGUAGE.
8. USE OF ANY INTOXICATING BEVERAGE OR DRUGS.
9. CARRYING & USE OF FIREARMS, BOWS & ARROWS.
10. HORSEBACK RIDING OR WALKING OF HORSES OR DOGS.
11. DEFACING OR DESTROYING THIS PROPERTY.

Nassau County Public High School Athletic Association SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Welcome to our school and to our interscholastic athletic program. We wish each and every one of the participants the best of luck in today's contest. We ask all of our spectators for their help and cooperation in conducting a safe, enjoyable and skillful contest. Please observe the code of conduct at all times.

1. Spectators are an important part of the game and shall at all times conform to an accepted standard of good sportsmanship and behavior.
2. Spectators shall at all times respect officials, coaches and players and extend all courtesies to them.
3. Wholesome cheering is encouraged.
4. Stamping of feet, taunting, foul and abusive language, inflammatory remarks, and disrespectful signs and behavior are not acceptable.*
(The expectation is for **quiet** during foul shots and while performing groups are on the floor)
5. Faculty supervised pep bands are permitted to play during "dead ball timer". However, spectator noise makers or sound devices are prohibited.
6. Spectators shall observe and obey the rules and regulations of the school concerning smoking, food and soft drinks consumption, use of lavatory facilities and the parking of cars.
7. New York State Law prohibits alcoholic beverages of any kind on school property; the law further prohibits any person under the influence of alcohol to be on school property.
8. Spectators shall respect and obey all school officials, supervisors, and police at all athletic contests.

VIOLATORS OF THIS CODE ARE SUBJECT TO EVICTION FROM THE AREA.

*** VIOLATIONS OF RULE 4 DURING A FREE THROW ATTEMPT WILL BE PENALIZED BY REPEATING THE FREE THROW, IF MISSED.** (The official will make the decision.)
